TSIBA Elevate is an international 6-week career accelerator programme. It is designed to prepare 18 to 24-year-olds with practical skills for success in the future job market, bridging the gap between studies and the real world. Week 1 is online, and weeks 2-6 in person, Cape Town.

Why this matters now

Even the most talented young people are finding it hard to secure their first role after university. Traditional advantages — strong grades, family networks, and prestigious schooling — no longer guarantee opportunity. The challenges are multiple and compounding:

- **Mismatch of skills vs. requirements**: Employers increasingly demand skills not always taught in traditional curricula.
- Lack of real-world experience: Internships and work experience are scarce, leaving many students with CVs that don't demonstrate what they can do.
- **High competition and low entry points:** Graduate vacancies now attract an average of 140 applications per role the highest in 30 years, with openings at their lowest level in seven years.
- **Globalisation and rapid change**: Al, digitalisation, and remote work are shifting the landscape faster than universities can adapt.
- **Al disruption:** Harvard Business Review warns that automating entry-level roles with Al strips away the "training ground" for future leaders. A Stanford University study shows employment for 22–25-year-olds in Al-exposed jobs has fallen by 13–20% since late 2022, cuts are concentrated in entry-level posts.



The message is clear: Grades and networks are no longer enough. What differentiates candidates today are skills, experience, perspective, and the ability to thrive alongside AI.

How TSIBA Elevate is different

On the surface, TSIBA Elevate could look like "just another summer school." But three distinctive features set it apart:

- ➤ One-for-One Social Impact Every fee-paying student sponsors a deserving African peer. One investment changes two lives a values-driven choice not just a CV booster.
- ➤ The "Secret Sauce" Peer Mix Students from world-class independent schools learn alongside African scholarship awardees who have earned their place through talent, ambition, and determination. This peer-learning exchange exposes students to cross-cultural agility and the competitive edge needed to thrive in a globalised job market.
- ➤ Immersion in a Global-South Innovation Hub Cape Town is one of the most innovative and entrepreneurial cities in the Global South. Students don't just learn leadership — they practice it where innovation is survival.

- Evidence for applications: The Keystone Project
 a tangible work product and compelling story for UCAS, Common App, or scholarship interviews.

- ➤ Entrepreneurship & Innovation: Gain the mindset and skills needed to solve complex problems and develop scalable business structures.
